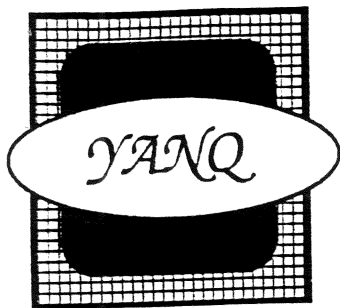

DEAR MEMBER

As many of you will be aware, YANQ held its first Policy Forum from 31 May - 2 June 1991.

Delegates representing 12 regions and 13 issue groups attended the Forum. YANQ Coordinating Committee members and staff brought total attendance to 48. We thank all those who attended and contributed 3 days of hard work for the development of YANQ.

The primary function of the Policy Forum was to provide an opportunity for YANQ members, through their delegates, to give direction to YANQ processes and programs for the 1991/1992 year. This has been achieved. The enclosed report on YANQ structures and processes, policy formulation and issues for action details the decisions made by the Policy Forum. These decisions are, in effect, being trialled for the next 12 months. Members will be able to comment on them at the 1992 Policy Forum and AGM.

You will also find enclosed lists of the delegates to the Forum and all our current members listed by region. This will enable interested members to contact each other if they wish.

ALL YANQ MEMBERS HAVE BEEN SENT THIS REPORT

Please retain the report in a safe place as it is your guide to how YANQ operates and its directions for 1991/1992. If you would like further information on any matter, please contact one of our staff members.

In conclusion, you may be interested to read a summary of Policy Forum participants' evaluations of some aspects of the Forum:

- 63% of participants strongly agreed they had gained a better understanding of YANQ, 31% mildly agreed and 6% mildly disagreed
- 81% of participants mildly agreed they had gained a better understanding of youth affairs generally and 19% mildly disagreed
- 54% of participants strongly agreed they had gained a better understanding of policy development, 40% mildly agreed and 6% strongly disagreed

To all those who attended the Forum, our thanks once more. To all members, we look forward to continuing to develop networks over the next 12 months and ask your cooperation in this. YANQ's services to members will only be relevant and useful when members themselves have ongoing input. YANQ is its members and information-sharing is, by definition, more than a one-way process.

YANQ STRUCTURES AND PROCESSES

A number of decisions were made at the 1991 Policy Forum regarding YANQ structures and processes. They are listed below.

1. Policy Forum

Policy Forums are an effective structure for securing the input of members to YANQ. They should be held annually.

2. Delegates to Policy Forum

Delegates to Policy Forum shall be Ordinary Members of YANQ. They shall not be employees of Commonwealth, State or Local Governments.

Each region shall select its delegate using a process agreed upon by the members in that region. However, all such processes will fall within broad guidelines provided by YANQ, in a publication it will develop entitled "YANQ Policy Forum Handbook".

The 1991 Policy Forum did not resolve whether Associate Members who are government employees can vote for delegates to Policy Forum. YANQ will endeavour to resolve this issue among its members in 1991-92.

Delegates' expenses in attending a Policy Forum should be subsidised by YANQ wherever possible.

3. Responsibilities of Delegates to Policy Forum

From 1992 onwards, delegates to Policy Forum should be able and willing to meet commitments in relation to YANQ. These commitments will exist from the conclusion of one Policy Forum to the election of a delegate to the next.

In turn, YANQ must resource delegates in a variety of ways (including financial) to fulfil their commitments.

Delegates should be prepared to:

- * approach their Management Committee and/or Agency to secure support in principle for their involvement with YANQ;
- * network within their region to identify resource needs of that region;
- * inform relevant people in their region of the purpose and nature of YANQ;
- * disseminate accurate information about the Policy Forum to YANQ members in their region;
- * liaise with YANQ staff on an occasional basis, particularly in the organisation of regional or sub-regional meetings or consultations;
- * inform YANQ of gaps or problems in YANQ's relationship with their region.

4. Composition of Co-ordinating Committee

The YANQ Co-ordinating Committee should, in principle, include members from areas other than South-East Queensland.

Where members from more remote areas are elected to the Co-ordinating Committee, annual meeting schedules must be adjusted accordingly eg four face-to-face meetings per year and eight telephone link-ups.

YANQ must plan its resource allocation accordingly, allowing for an appropriate number of airfares and telephone linkups.

5. Communication of YANQ Activities to Members

The YANQ newsletter, published quarterly, shall be used to keep members well informed of YANQ activities.

In particular, each issue shall include a summary of the Co-ordinating Committee meetings which have occurred since the last newsletter.

Where appropriate, members shall also be informed of YANQ activities by letter, fax or telephone call. This is particularly relevant to the issues discussed in the following section on "Policy Formulation".

6. Involvement of Young People in YANQ

The Policy Forum is not necessarily the best means for YANQ to incorporate the input of young people and YANQ should continue to explore other means for achieving this.

However, this does not exclude the input of young people at the Policy Forum if they are an appropriate delegate elected by their region.

When appropriate, regional members and groups should consult with young people in their areas when asked for input from YANQ.

YANQ should also work to establish other arenas and projects where young people may speak for and represent themselves on issues about which YANQ is seeking information.

YANQ POLICY FORMULATION

1. Initiation of Policy Issues

Issues can be drawn to the attention of YANQ in a number of ways.

Members, regional groups of members, issue-groups, Co-ordinating Committee members and staff members may all raise issues for discussion and policy development.

Annual Policy Forums will give direction on which issues YANQ should prioritise. If issues are raised between forums, the process outlined below under "Issues Which Arise Unexpectedly" shall be followed.

2. Notification to Members

Once it has been decided that YANQ will develop a policy paper or a position on an issue, members must be informed of this fact as soon as possible and where possible.

3. Working Parties

The Co-ordinating Committee has the discretion to recommend the formation of working parties to research particular issues. Interested YANQ members and persons with particularly relevant experience will form such parties.

It will be necessary to use a variety of means (phone, fax, mail) for these working parties to operate effectively. YANQ will resource them as much as possible.

4. Data Collection in Relation to Policy Issues

Stage I: YANQ staff must collect data relevant to the issue under scrutiny. This information will be gathered from the work of other researchers, the field, persons with particular expertise, government and other relevant sources.

Members or Co-ordinating Committee members may participate in the information gathering process at a local, sub-regional or regional level. This may include individual research, working party membership or formal or informal consultation with young people, members or other appropriate persons.

Stage II: YANQ staff will convene regional or sub-regional meetings in consultation with members regarding date, time and location. (Sub-regional meetings mean there will be more than one meeting per region.)

At these meetings staff will listen to opinions regarding the issue under discussion. This will be one opportunity for members, groups and, where appropriate, young people, to convey to YANQ data they have gathered on the issue. The time and frequency of such meetings will be affected by available YANQ resources (human and financial).

6. Preparation and Circulation of Draft Policy Paper

YANQ staff will next prepare a preliminary draft of a policy paper on the issue concerned. This will be circulated for comment to all members and other relevant groups and persons.

7. Policy Forum

Elected delegates will attend an annual Policy Forum to develop policies using the policy papers which have been researched, drafted and circulated in the previous year.

Delegates will bring to the Policy Forum their region's or group's concerns and suggestions in relation to the policy papers.

The Policy Forum will clarify goals, objectives and strategies in relation to the issues under discussion.

8. Delegates Report Back to Regions/Issue Groups

Delegates will report back to their regions/issue groups on the results of the Policy Forum.

Policy papers will be amended in the light of Policy Forum decisions. They will then be distributed to members and other relevant groups and persons for further comment. Where necessary, YANQ staff will consult further with any members or groups with particular concerns. When agreement is reached, a final document will be prepared.

9. Implementation of Policy

Policy papers will be adopted and implemented when YANQ staff and the Co-ordinating Committee are of the opinion that adequate information and sufficient agreement of members has been obtained.

"Sufficient agreement" will normally mean a consensus of members. Where consensus proves impossible, at least 75% agreement shall be required for a policy to be adopted.

Where regions or issue groups have deep concerns about the majority view, their minority views will be included in any representations on that issue, provided the minority views are not contrary to YANQ principles.

10. Issues Which Arise Unexpectedly

Where issues arise unexpectedly and responses/reports are requested in areas where policy has not been determined, YANQ staff and Co-ordinating Committee will circulate information about the issue and the request.

This will be followed by papers for discussion and feedback and collection of additional data. This information and consultation will occur using fax, mail and/or telephone linkup.

Where decisions can be reached based on adequate information and agreement, the policy is implemented.

Where adequate regional information is not available, it is the prerogative of the Co-ordinating Committee whether to respond to the issue.

If a response is made (or not made), this will be communicated to members.

Responses made without adequate regional information must be prefaced with the words "A full consultation with our members is not possible due to time constraints."

Where possible, such responses will be interim statements only.

ISSUES PRESENTED FOR WORKSHOP DISCUSSION AT 1991 POLICY FORUM

Delegates were asked to provide YANQ with a list of issues affecting young people which their region or group considered were priority issues for YANQ to address. From these lists, 12 workshop topics were developed for discussion at the Policy Forum:

1. NEEDS AND PROBLEMS SPECIFIC TO YOUNG PEOPLE IN RURAL/REMOTE AREAS.
2. NEEDS AND PROBLEMS SPECIFIC TO ABORIGINAL AND ISLANDER YOUNG PEOPLE.
3. NEEDS AND PROBLEMS SPECIFIC TO YOUNG WOMEN
4. EDUCATION AND TRAINING NEEDS OF YOUNG PEOPLE
5. HOUSING FOR 12-18 YEAR OLDS
6. INCOME SECURITY FOR YOUNG PEOPLE
7. ALCOHOL AND DRUG USE/MISUSE AMONG YOUNG PEOPLE
8. DISCRIMINATION FACING YOUNG PEOPLE IN SERVICE DELIVERY
9. OUTREACH HEALTH SERVICES FOR DISADVANTAGED YOUNG PEOPLE
10. THE IMPACT OF THE CURRENT JUSTICE SYSTEM ON YOUNG PEOPLE
11. CONDITIONS AND TRAINING FOR WORKERS IN THE NON-GOVERNMENT YOUTH SECTOR
12. THE RECREATIONAL NEEDS OF YOUNG PEOPLE

ISSUES FOR ACTION: YANQ DIRECTION FOR 1991-92

Each of the 12 issues workshops produced information and recommendations regarding the issue they discussed.

Then the Policy Forum as a whole decided upon appropriate directions for YANQ as it seeks to address the 12 issues.

1. NEEDS AND PROBLEMS SPECIFIC TO YOUNG PEOPLE IN RURAL/REMOTE AREAS

YANQ to work to raise the profile of this issue and define a YANQ policy in relation to it through research and consultation.

Regional networks to identify areas of need.

YANQ to particularly consult with Queensland Rural Youth.

To consider this interest group when formulating any other responses or policies.

2. NEEDS AND PROBLEMS SPECIFIC TO ABORIGINAL AND ISLANDER YOUNG PEOPLE

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander delegates to Policy Forum to initiate the formation of an ATSI Youthworkers/Youth Issues Network. Existing networks to be used in this process.

YANQ to encourage and resource the formation of this group where possible.

To consider this interest group when formulating any other responses or policies.

3. NEEDS AND PROBLEMS SPECIFIC TO YOUNG WOMEN

YANQ to work to raise the profile of this issue and define a YANQ policy in relation to it through research and consultation.

To consult widely with already established groups dealing with issues relating to young women.

To consider this interest group when formulating any other responses or policies.

4. EDUCATION AND TRAINING NEEDS OF YOUNG PEOPLE

This issue is already being addressed at a national level by the Youth Affairs Council of Australia (YACA).

YANQ to liaise with YACA and also with Skillshares, Student Councils and Student Guilds.

To disseminate information from these sources to members.

5. HOUSING FOR 12-18 YEAR OLDS

There are already groups established around this issue which have considerable knowledge and expertise in relation to it, including:

- * South East Queensland Youth Accommodation Coalition (SEQYAC)
- * the North Queensland Youth Accommodation Coalition (NORQYAC)
- * the Young Women's Housing Group (YWHG)
- * the National Youth Coalition on Housing (NYCH).

These groups are already liaising with government and the community regarding housing issues affecting young people.

YANQ to consult, support and exchange information with these existing networks. To disseminate information to YANQ members.

6. INCOME SECURITY FOR YOUNG PEOPLE

Like education and training this is an issue already being addressed at a national level by youth affairs organisations.

State and Territory peak youth affairs bodies (including YANQ) are currently submitting a joint funding submission to run a major project to research a report on the issue of income security for young people.

This project will have a very broad perspective and will include historical and analytical research of youth employment, social security benefits for young people and AUSTUDY.

The project will be co-ordinated by the Youth Action and Policy Association (the NSW peak youth affairs body) and a Support Committee with members from a number of States and Territories.

All State and Territory peak bodies will contribute time and resources and hold a launch of the report in their own State or Territory. They will also distribute the report in their own State or Territory.

7. ALCOHOL AND DRUG USE/MISUSE AMONG YOUNG PEOPLE

YANQ to work to raise the profile of this issue and define a YANQ policy in relation to it through research and consultation.

YANQ to particularly research innovative effective strategies in this area.

YANQ to consult with Qld Alcohol and Drug Foundation, Drug Arm, Australian Association for Adolescent Health (AAAH), QUIVVA, Queensland Aids Council.

8. DISCRIMINATION FACING YOUNG PEOPLE IN SERVICE DELIVERY

YANQ to work to raise the profile of this issue and define a YANQ policy in relation to it through research and consultation.

To liaise particularly with the interest groups most affected by discrimination (eg ATSI, non-English speaking background [NESB], women, differently abled, gay and lesbian).

9. OUTREACH HEALTH SERVICES FOR DISADVANTAGED YOUNG PEOPLE

There are already a number of groups working on this issue.

YANQ to resource where possible and exchange information with Australian Association for Adolescent Health (AAAH), Queensland Aids Council, Community Health groups, Women's Health Centre and other relevant groups and individuals (particularly remote and/or ATSI networks) in developing responses and positions on this issue.

Disseminate information to members.

10. IMPACT OF CURRENT JUSTICE SYSTEM ON YOUNG PEOPLE

There already exists a Queensland Youth Justice Coalition (YJC) which is organised around and responds to justice issues affecting young people.

YANQ to resource where possible and exchange information with the YJC.

Disseminate information to members.

11. CONDITIONS/TRAINING FOR WORKERS IN THE NON-GOVERNMENT YOUTH SECTOR

The Australian Social Welfare Union (ASWU) and the Youth Sector Training Council of Queensland (YSTC) are the two primary groups already addressing issues relating to conditions and training for workers in the youth sector.

YANQ to liaise and exchange information with these groups in particular in responding to this issue.

Disseminate information to members.

12. RECREATIONAL NEEDS OF YOUNG PEOPLE

YANQ to work to raise the profile of this issue and define a YANQ policy in relation to it through research and consultation.

Regional networks to identify specific areas of need.

YANQ to consult with appropriate bodies.
